Eligibility

- Any child under 13 years old who is identified as American Indian/Alaska Native in the latest U.S. Decennial Census, as updated by the American Community Survey. They must be enrolled, or have a parent enrolled, in a federally recognized tribe to receive services under this grant.
- Parent(s) must be working, in school, or participating in job training.
- Parent(s) must meet income requirements. (see table in next Column)
- Families will be responsible for a copayment that is based on a sliding fee scale. Copays will range from 0-7% per child with a max of 7% per family, regardless of number of children.

- Verification of a family's eligibility is required, and includes but is not limited to:
- Child's birth certificate
- ► W2 form
- Employment verification letter
- ► Most recent tax return.
- Letter from job training coordinator or academic institution's administrative office.
- Household composition (needs to be listed by applicant on application.)
- 2 forms of applicant identification (driver's license, passport, birth certificate, etc.)
- Proof of residence (utility bill, lease, etc.)
